The following are highlights of SACHA's work with survivors and within the community in 2016/2017:

New On-line Chatting and Texting on Support Line

SACHA is thrilled to participate in the Ontario Coalition of Rape Crisis Centre's (OCRCC) Innovation Grant in order to pilot on-line chatting and texting within our Support Line services. Our Crisis Support Program Coordinator has been working closely with OCRCC to develop all the required technical and training supports for SACHA's participation. We will launch this exciting project in June 2017.

Public Education Programs: Increasing Requests

Our Public Education Program (PEP) continues to experience rising demand to deliver workshops, trainings and education sessions for secondary schools, universities/colleges, community groups and professionals. Currently, SACHA is unable to keep up with the volume of requests and are deeply disappointed when we have to turn down speaking engagements. We have determined that we require another full-time PEP staff member in order to keep up with community demand. We continue to explore ways to fund increases to our PEP program; we recognize that prevention education is key to creating a culture of consent.

Survivors Reaching Out

SACHA's Counselling and Advocacy Program is experiencing increased demand for counselling services for survivors of all genders. As community and media conversations about sexual violence continue to be more prominent, we have tracked an increase in requests for service. We struggle to balance the need for quick access to individual, shorter-term support and our ability to offer longer-term, ongoing trauma support. Adding to this challenge is the need to offer group-counselling

programs (we offered five groups in 2016/17). One thing we know: our community is in need of additional counselling support for survivors of all forms of sexual violence.

International Women's Day

On March 8th, SACHA's Diverse Communities Outreach Program, in collaboration with numerous community partners, held a successful International Women's Day event for 125 community members. With our amazing keynote speaker, Nicky Bomberry, from the Hamilton Regional Indian Centre, and a panel of women sharing their experiences as newcomers, it was an exciting and informative day!
