- Relevant College and/or University degree or relevant experience working with survivors of sexual violence
- Ability to respond effectively to the needs of survivors from diverse backgrounds and life experiences and to offer appropriate counselling and advocacy supports
- Knowledge of appropriate community resources
- Strong interpersonal, communication (oral and written), team-building, and problem-solving skills
- Ability to work independently with minimal supervision
- Willingness to be trained to provide support on our 24-hour support line during office
- Evening availability on Wednesdays
- Willingness to flex time as required
