- A minimum of 3 years of experience in volunteer management including: volunteer recruitment, screening, training and skills development, support and supervision
- Experience offering counselling and co-facilitating groups to individuals who have experienced sexual violence
- Relevant College and/or University degree or relevant experience working with survivors of sexual violence
- A strong understanding of sexual violence from an intersectional feminist, anti-racist, anti-oppressive perspective
- Ability to respond effectively to the needs of survivors from diverse backgrounds and life experiences
- Knowledge of appropriate community resources
- Strong interpersonal, communication (oral and written), team-building, and problem-solving skills
- Ability to work independently with minimal supervision
- Willingness to flex time as required
- Ability to speak a second language in addition to English is a definite asset.
